Why the Area Information Service/Literature Distribution Center program director should have a report at AWSC meetings and Assemblies.

- The director provides a central point for contact for questions. Recently our delegate called the director to inquire about the Alateen Coordinator duties in the Intergroup of SE Wisconsin.
- There should be cooperation with the Area Group Records Coordinator to update group meetings. Many of the groups in SE Wisconsin will let our local service know of group changes and forget about sending to Area 61. AIS forwards all information and hopes the Area will send updates of groups in SE Wisconsin to them. -Service Manual p64
- The AIS can serve as an avenue for local public outreach with cooperation of the districts. The Public Outreach coordinator can cooperate with the Intergroup Public Outreach chairperson. -Service Manual p64 and 162
- The AIS would like to use the program director as a liaison to the Area. They no longer have a volunteer position as Area Liaison. Since this is a paid position the Area cannot use the program director as an Area Coordinator. -Service Manual p101
- The program director can provide communication assistance between chairs of Intergroup committees and their respective Area Coordinators -Service Manual p101
- When using Posters and Flyers for Public Outreach, Districts, AIS, and Areas work together on the projects to ensure the message remains consistent and unity among the service arms is ensured. -Service Manual p112
