District #10 Assembly Concerns

Our district met recentl, and members expressed concerns about the Assemblies lower attendance. Our feelings are that some of that is caused by the argumentative conversations that are a turn-off to members and the longer meetings are not always productive. The members would like to work towards having a group inventory in our Assembly or help with Assembly Committee or Task Force. Our goal is to make a positive impact to attract other GRs

to our Assemblies and we are willing to help bring about this change through taking an active part on the Assembly Committee.

Some suggestions from our groups are outlined below:

- Have an uplifting speaker; maybe hire one like at the Convention.
- Try to have the meeting shorter by having GRs review materials before the Assembly and then the Officers and Coordinators just recap with any new items or questions on what was submitted. Maybe have some reports printed on Friday night or online so GRs and members can review in advance.
- Send a reminder to members to review documents before the Assembly.
- Can we have more Task Force/Committee meetings via conference call to eliminate the afternoon business session?
- Issue with members talking too long – how can leadership address these? Can we use time boxes for a specific topic? Perhaps have a workshop on Effective Leadership? There may be a need at times to assertively interrupt someone who is not following the principles; a large number of attendees are inexperienced GRs leaving this to the leadership to handle.
- Can members submit questions or comments before the Assembly so the officers and coordinators can get the answers prepared ahead of time?
- Submit the budget online a month before the meeting for members to review and ask questions in advance to avoid all the questions at Assembly? Review for math errors in advance?
- Half day for business meeting and the other half for panels/speakers?
- Many of our GRs are in meetings and long days during the week and it's hard to commit to a long day of meetings, especially when there are heated discussions that seem to bring up the same idea/comments.
- Our leaders are trusted servants – do we have to question everything that is done?
